If you have an urgent problem that cannot wait until we reopen at 8.30am the following day, you can contact GP Out of hours.

The GP Out Of Hours Service provides care for people in Belfast when their normal GP surgery is closed. It is not intended to replace normal GP services, but deals with urgent problems that cannot wait until your own GP is available. You should therefore only use this service if you are suddenly ill and you cannot wait until your GP's surgery is open.

You may be aware that that the Covid-19 vaccine booster programme has been expanded to all adults, over the age of 18, for whom three months have passed since their second vaccine. If this applies to you, and you have not yet had your booster vaccine, we would encourage you to come forward and get one at the very earliest opportunity.

Information for parents and carers

Everyone has a role to play in keeping our schools safe and helping to stop the spread of COVID-19. Please don't send your child to school if they have COVID-19 symptoms such as:

- a high temperature
- a new continuous cough
- loss of or change to their sense of taste or smell

If your child does not have symptoms of COVID-19 but has other cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, they do not need to be tested and they or members of your household do not need to self-isolate. Your child can attend school if fit to do so.
